Discussion - Mullaney's Fish Market; Joby Norton

- Joby is seeking ideas for how to improve Mullaney's Fish Market currently seeking Zoning Board and Planning Board approval for expansion of existing facilities
- Proposing a "green building" with solar panels, green space, and energy efficient storage of fresh fish
 - o Propose to increase retail space from 150 sq feet to 400 sq feet
 - Include more retail offerings
 - o Propose to increase processing space from 200 sq ft to 800 sq feet
 - Only company on the South Shore that processes fish, otherwise the fish has to travel to processing centers in Boston, New Bedford, or Gloucester, which increases costs
 - Anticipates 15-20% reduction in costs by processing fish at proposed facility, while also increasing profit for Mullaney's
 - O Anticipates adding 10-15 new jobs
 - Currently has 6-8 Full Time Employees, and goal is to have around 20
 - Wants to cross train fisherman additional income while not fishing;
 depending on weather and quotas usually only fish 80 days of the year
- Ultimate goal is to improve and expand his own business, and improve the fishing industry in Scituate Harbor
- Rebrand and promote local Scituate Fish marketing ideas?
 - Let the public know when fishing boats are unloading 2-3 times per week
 - Utilize social media
 - Local fish at Scituate schools with educational component
 - Local catch CSA attempted in the past
 - Website/App ordering service regular updates with daily catch information and ability to order through the website or App and pick up fresh fish next day
 - Currently being used, but could use improvements
 - o Restaurant component?
 - Discussed pros and cons of adding restaurant to proposed space
 - Small space would only provide 140 seats
 - Focus on processing for now
 - Utilize space currently rented by Silent Chef?
 - Pros and Cons of branding "Scituate" fish fluctuation in price as hardest obstacle
 - O Take away items frozen dinners in retail space
 - Restaurant demonstrations and competitions (such as oyster shucking)
 - o Fish Fry @ Heritage Days
 - Farm to Table event similar to that suggested by Paul at previous meetings; discussed potential names for event

• Plan is for EDC to work with Mullaney's on marketing local fish once town board approval is achieved.

Sea Scituate Directional Signage and Harbor Kiosk

- \$7000 for 16 signs
 - Ted and Brad will propose suggested locations for the signs at next meeting for EDC to vote on
- \$10,000 for informational kiosks
 - o Concern with future maintenance costs
 - Want to ensure if we have a hand carved piece that it will not get destroyed by storms this winter
 - Need to select location that has high visibility and utility
 - Potential for sign that can be removed in bad weather
- Discussion of who is responsible for Harbor Walk signs?
 - o Historical commission?

Commission Priorities

- Top priority Greenbush District Zoning bylaw
 - Want to present at Spring town meeting
 - Need to meet with Planning Board
 - O Want to plan another information session open to the public in early November
- Bringing the Harbor Merchants and Scituate Chamber of Commerce together to work on mutual goals in Scituate Harbor
 - Heritage Days need to foster collaboration between the two groups
 - Outside vendors detract from local businesses
 - Many are members of both organizations find common ground
- Budget plan needs to be completed by end of 2018 for next fiscal year
- Committee liaison assignments
 - o North Scituate Ann
 - o Harbor RJ (member) and Fran (guest)
 - o Greenbush Geena
 - o Humarock needs to be filled
- Events Committee
 - Discussed more at next meeting with budget priorities
 - o Add Scituate fish to First Fridays
 - o Farm to fork event to promote local food

Planning and Development Updates

- Potential for zoning grant in North Scituate
- Interviewing consultant for Master Plan
 - o Master Plan will shape vision for the town
 - Intend to form group with liaisons from all town committees and boards for input and guidance for the master plan 12-18 month process
- Housing Production Grant Plan adding affordable housing in zoning bylaws
- Waiting on Mass Works Grant should know by end of the month
- Regional Sewer Meeting 1 to 2 weeks ago

- O Towns pick top priority areas to add sewer
 - Scituate has selected North Scituate
- o Momentum in meetings to move forward with regional sewer project
