# MEETING MINUTES BOARD OF SELECTMEN July 7, 2015

The Meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM

#### **Acceptance of Agenda**

Mr. Harris made a MOTION to accept the agenda for July 7, 2015. Second by Mr. O'Toole, All in favor. Unanimous vote (5-0).

Walk-In's There were none present.

# **Report of the Town Administrator**

4<sup>th</sup> of July no major incidents. This is the fourth year of the bon fire ban. The police had 195 calls Thursday to Sunday night, 9 arrests and 7 were minors, 2 disorderly, and 4 protective custody's and 2 motor vehicles. The Narcan policy is implemented and they had two successful deployments this weekend. Both patients regained consciousness and were transported to South Shore Hospital. There were many calls to the fire department this weekend. Ms. Vinchesi wanted to thank Police, Fire and DPW for a great job this weekend. Ms. Vinchesi thanked the residents for abiding by the law and Town policies.

Beach sticker sales are the same this year as last year but they were purchased a lot earlier this season. The parking lot spaces fill up quickly. There are six additional spaces at Humarock this year since it was redesigned with the basketball courts. We have had double the amount of trash and double the usage of port-a-potties at the beaches. We did have extra DPW people for trash. We encourage people to carry in and carry out their trash off the beach. There should be no household trash left at the beaches. We are looking at getting additional port-a-potties at the beaches.

Mr. Vegnani said it was great that the police revived those people but that was two overdoses. The beaches were really crowded this weekend and if the volume stays this high at the beaches, we need to address the trash and port-a-potties.

Ms. Vinchesi is proud to accept the award for Best of Boston 2015 "Best Town Center" and presented the framed award to the Board of Selectmen. We have made 40 copies of the award and Ms. Vinchesi will distribute them to the businesses in the harbor as soon as possible. Mr. Vegnani said the merchants should be very proud.

Ms. Vinchesi encouraged residents to take the SLOOP to the harbor and visit the merchants. Mr. Vegnani mentioned GATRA, the Scituate SLOOP, has just begun in Scituate and residents

should take advantage of it. There are limited funds and this is a pilot program. It started July  $2^{nd}$  and is free for two weeks.

# <u>United States Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Excellence in Financial Reporting Award to Nancy Holt, Finance Director & Patricia Vinchesi, Town Administrator</u>

Mr. Vegnani congratulated and thanked Ms. Holt and Ms. Vinchesi on receiving this outstanding award for excellence in financial reporting. Ms. Holt said it has 10 years' worth of history and every department had a hand in this. Ms. Curran thanked Ms. Holt and Ms. Vinchesi. Mr. Danehey said this award shows from a Federal level the transparency of our finances and what a great job is being done in the Town of Scituate.

# MMA & Moakley Center for Public Management, Suffolk University Certificate Program Graduates - Rick Mosca, Linda Hayes and John Murphy

This program is offered jointly between the MMA and Suffolk University School of Public Management.

The program rotates each year to a different geographic area in the Commonwealth. This past year it was on the South Shore.

Applications were solicited from South Shore municipal employees and participants chosen by a three-member Admissions Committee consisting of area town administrators. Seven Scituate employees applied and there application had to be approved in advance by the Town Administrator. COA Director Linda Hayes, Fire Chief John Murphy and Acting Sewer Superintendent Rick Mosca were selected to attend.

The course involves rigorous graduate level work equal to 15 course credits. Students have been meeting every Friday, all day, since last September. Graduation certificates to 22 students were awarded on June 22 at Suffolk. 100% class attendance is expected and there are research papers, case studies and class presentations required. The cost of the \$2,500 per person program was shared 50-50 by the employee and the Town under its 123 Training Budget. Work time off on these Fridays was also granted for the nine months.

Training such as this benefits not only the employee, but the department, other staff and the community as a whole. I am very proud of each of these individuals.

The Selectmen thanked all of the applicants and informed them they would be voting at the end of this meeting or at a future meeting.

#### **Heritage Days Update, Greg Morse**

Greg Morse is representing the Committee for Heritage Days.

The following changes were presented:

- 1. To allow vendors on Front Street between Otis and Allen.
- 2. To eliminate the 2<sup>nd</sup> music stage near the boat ramp.
- 3. To eliminate the food tent and "Taste of Scituate" event.
- 4. To withdraw the request for a liquor license.
- 5. To allow parking and access around the back of Cole Parkway, specifically along the waterfront.

Mr. Morse presented a large map to the Board of Selectmen outlining the plan for Heritage Days. Sgt. Gilmartin said it works well to park on one side of Kent Street as was done for the St. Patrick's Day parade. Mr. Vegnani and Mr. Danehey suggested the Chamber speak with St. Mary's to discuss parking on Sunday. Mr. Danehey asked why the stage location is where it is and suggested the stage background be the harbor. The committee wants to leave the stage where it is. Chief Murphy said he is satisfied with the current plan and the fire department has much better access this year. Sgt. Gilmartin said the bus drop off and pick up area will be in front of the Jack Conway building.

Wednesday afternoon at noon the parking spots will be blocked to set up the staging area. Security barriers will be put up while the set-up is going on. Ms. Vinchesi asked where the banks of porta potties will be located and asked the committee to consider making them more accessible to the public. Mr. Vegnani asked if they would be using more of Cole Parkway than they have in past years. The committee said yes they will have less parking available and people should park at the Greenbush parking lot. Kevin Cafferty will consult with Kevin Kelly regarding the chairs that were stored at the library. Mr. O'Toole asked if Wednesday at noon would be the start time for set up. Gerry said yes the set up will begin at noon on Wednesday.

# Sale of Town Owned Land - Greenbush, Mr. Terry Conroy, Conroy Development

Mr. Conroy, 40 York Street, Canton, MA is purchasing the MBTA parking lot on Old Driftway and provided the Board of Selectmen with a map outlining the property. Mr. Joseph Lynch, the engineer from Foxboro, MA attended with Mr. Conroy. The MBTA shows an easement. There is a piece of land owned by the Town of Scituate. There are 54 units planned on 2.5 acres with retail on the Old Driftway side, second and third floor would be apartments and the third building would have three floors of apartments. Mr. Danehey asked what the time frame is for Mr. Conroy. Ms. Vinchesi said a time table would need to be put together to see if we can accomplish this by Town Meeting. Mr. Harris asked what is needed. Ms. Vinchesi said we need to see what is required for the sale of Town owned land. Ms. Vinchesi will have her staff review this and can have a report back to the Board in two weeks.

# FY15 Year End Transfers, Nancy Holt, Town Accountant

Ms. Holt reviewed the year end transfers with the Board of Selectmen.

#### **DPW Contracts, Kevin Cafferty, DPW Director**

#### 1. Oceanside Drive Seawall Contract

The Board of Selectmen asked if we have all the easements and Mr. Cafferty said we finally do have the easements. Mr. Harris asked when it would take place. Mr. Cafferty hopes in four weeks. The job could be up to two years. Mr. Cafferty will be working to get this work done aggressively. Clerk of the works will be Dan Smith. The seawall will be two feet higher and deeper. It is a different design system. This is part of our overall master plan.

Move that the Board of Selectmen award the contract for construction services associated with the replacement of 786 feet of concrete seawall located between 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue on Oceanside Drive to SPS New England of Salisbury, MA for \$3,488,800.00. #### 2. Edward Foster Road Seawall Contract

This is the seawall at 138 Edward Foster Road. It is more expensive because it is a smaller section. There were six bidders total on this. This project will be paid for by seven different sources; Fore Shore Protection, FEMA money, DCR Grants, Article V at Town Meeting, Roads and Seawall money and Fore Shore Protection from Article 14. Coastline Engineering drew up the plans.

Move that the Board of Selectmen award the contract for construction services associated with the replacement of 185 feet of concrete seawall located at 138 Edward Foster Road to Northern Construction of Weymouth, MA for \$1,289,800. Motion by Mr. O'Toole second by Mr. Danehey Unanimous Vote (5-0)

#### 3. Phase 2C Water Main Contract

Mr. Cafferty would like to put this on hold to investigate the company further. We will add this to the next Board of Selectmen Agenda.

#### 4. Sewer Pump Station Contract SKADA Equipment
