The Meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m.

Acceptance of Agenda

Mr. O'Toole made a MOTION to accept the agenda for March 22, 2016. Second by Ms. Curran, all in favor. Unanimous vote (4-0).

Walk Ins – Mr. Daniel Monger has received private donations for the Scituate Skate Park. \$13,964.13 is received to date. Motion to accept a donation in the amount of \$13,964.13 from the Friends of Scituate Recreation to be used for the skate park. Motion by Mr. Danehey Second by Mr. O'Toole Unanimous Vote (4-0)

Report of the Town Administrator – Patricia Vinchesi

- Public Facilities Update The library project roof design is being worked on. The public safety building temporary curb cut will be done. Everything will be in place for the delivery of the steel. Over the course of a week the contractor will be bringing it in. Notices will be provided.
- FEMA Update There is a meeting with FEMA this Thursday with the Towns of Scituate, Marshfield and Duxbury. Leslie Fields from Woods Hole Group will be joining the Towns. There will be a report back to the Selectmen after the meeting.
- We are preparing for Town Meeting.
- Mr. Vegnani said the trucks are idling at the Scituate Town Library project. The Chief of Police had a meeting with the contractor last Thursday and the Project Manager. The start time is 7 a.m. Ms.Vinchesi has a copy of the letter sent to the contractor by Daedalus.

SCHEDULED ITEMS:

Country Way Trail Contract, Al Bangert, Special Projects Coordinator

Mr. Bangert provided an overview of the project. Bids for the construction of the first phase of the Trail were solicited. The engineering was paid for by the DPW in 2013. The trail will be granite curbed and six feet wide. It will meet all accessibility guidelines.

Move that the Board of Selectmen vote to award the contract for the construction of the first phase of the Country Way Multi-Use Trail (Contract #16-CPC-3) to Aqualine Utility Inc. of Weymouth, MA in the amount of \$549,000 as specified in their bid response dated March 18, 2016. Motion by Mr. Danehey Second by Ms. Curran Unanimous Vote (4-0)

<u>DPW Projects</u>, Kevin Cafferty, DPW Director & Sean McCarthy, Town Engineer <u>Complete Streets Policy</u>

Mr. Cafferty reviewed the complete streets program run by the Governors office. Mr. Danehey asked about the formation of the committee. Mr. Cafferty said there are guidelines on who needs to be on the committee that will be addressed if approved at this meeting. The Town would be able to apply for grants under this policy. Jeffrey Calla 28 Kent Street asked how residents would be included in the decisions of where sidewalks are needed. Mr. Vegnani explained that there is a list for the Town that was reviewed and approved several years ago.

Motion to accept the Complete Streets Policy. Motion by Mr. Danehey Second by Mr. O'Toole Unanimous Vote (4-0)

Mr. O'Toole asked about the status of sidewalks in the harbor. Mr. Cafferty said the DPW has made paint marks where there are cracks or damage to the sidewalks. There are two or three really bad areas that will be fixed sooner. There will be a bid that will go out to repair these areas. Mr. Danehey asked if the DPW can look at the pot hole across from Jamie's restaurant and fix it. Mr. Cafferty said he would take a look.

MAPC South Shore Regional Services Consortium for Unit Price Contract Awards

Move that the Board of Selectmen award the contracts to provide Supplies and Services to the Department of Public Works to:

Motion by Mr. Danehey Second by Ms. Curran Unanimous Vote (4-0)

Water trenches on various locations throughout Scituate, First Parish Road from Grove to Country Way, First Parish from Bell Tower Lane to the Railroad tracks drainage improvements and the roadway. Ms. Curran asked why it wouldn't be done from Cudworth down to the railroad tracks. Mr. Cafferty said they will look at that. The sidewalk is in bad condition and needs to be improved. Hatherly Road from First Ave. to Egypt Beach Road will be redone also. The upper section of Glades Road from Baileys Causeway to Gannet Road will be edge to edge paved and sidewalks. Beaver Dam and Tilden intersection will also be reviewed. These improvements are approximately \$1.8M-\$2M. Mr. Danehey asked where the money was coming from. Mr. Cafferty said it was Chapter 90 money and DPW funds. Ann Burbine, Pennycress Road said the parking lot that faces Gannett Road has bars sticking up and needs to be addressed. The island installed is not wide enough for handicap accessibility. Mr. Cafferty said he would take a look at it.

Water Conservation Plan, John Clarkeson, Chairman Water Resource Commission Mr. Clarkeson discussed the development of the Water Conservation Plan and it is a step that each community takes. The Water Resource Commission is looking for additional members who have an experience in waste water. Samantha said there are some communities that are ahead of the curve but Scituate is right up there with them. The Town has looked at our natural resources to see how healthy our water supply is currently. There is a lot of work to be done to incorporate water conservation measures.

<u>Traffic Rules and Regulations Committee Recommendations, MAPC Parking Study,</u> Lieutenant Mark Thompson

Lt. Thompson attended the Board of Selectmen meeting to discuss the MAPC parking study. Currently, from an enforcement standpoint it is relatively inconsistent. The tiered elements to parking were reviewed for 2 hour parking, all day parking and overnight parking. One way areas were reviewed and the group agrees the one way traffic pattern is a good approach. We want to make it safer for people and have an effective traffic flow. A traffic flow change is recommended. The MAPC study said our signs are very inconsistent and this needs to be addressed. Outside of the Harbormasters office there would be the addition of a loading zone so people bringing things to their boats can load and unload what they need. Handicap parking spaces and loading zones were identified on the plan. Pedestrian crossing areas are recommended within the plan. The Mill Wharf area is privately owned and was not included in the Traffic Rules and Regulations Committee recommendations. The Town Pier needs better signage and clearly delineated for the public and fisherman. Restriping and signage on Front Street are under consideration. The Selectmen would like to put this on a future agenda for discussion when Mr. Harris can review. We can add this to an upcoming agenda after review by Traffic Rules & Regulations.

Borrowing, Pam Avitabile, Treasurer Collector

1. Interfund Borrowing from the Stabilization Fund

Move that the Board of Selectmen approve the Interfund Borrowing request prepared by the Treasurer collector in the amount of \$1,025,000 for Phase II of the ESCO project and the Chain Pond Pumping Station. Motion by Mr. Danehey Second by Mr. O'Toole Unanimous Vote (4-0)

2. Refunding of General Obligation Bonds

Ms. Avitabile, Ms. Holt, and Ms. Vinchesi participated in an S&P rating conference call and we were rated a AA+ and we were able to refund this bond at 1.39% resulting in a significant savings for the Town.

I, the Clerk of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Scituate, Massachusetts (the "Town"), certify that at a meeting of the board held March 22, 2016, of which meeting all members of the board were duly notified and at which a quorum was present, the following votes were unanimously passed, all of which appear upon the official record of the board in my custody:

<u>Voted</u>: That in order to reduce interest costs, the Treasurer is authorized to issue refunding bonds, at one time or from time to time, pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 21A of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, to refund all of the Town's \$11,906,000 General Obligation Municipal Purpose Loan of 2005 Bonds dated March 1, 2005 maturing on and after March 1, 2017 (collectively, the "Refunded Bonds") and that the proceeds of any refunding bonds issued pursuant to this vote shall be used to pay the principal, redemption premium and interest on the Refunded Bonds and costs of issuance of the refunding bonds.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that the sale of the \$3,805,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds of the Town dated March 30, 2016 (the "Bonds"), to Raymond James & Associates, Inc. at the price of \$4,144,539.60 and accrued interest is hereby approved and confirmed. The Bonds shall be payable on March 1 of the years and in the principal amounts and bear interest at the respective rates, as follows:

<u>Further Voted</u>: that in connection with the marketing and sale of the Bonds, the preparation and distribution of a Notice of Sale and Preliminary Official Statement dated March 9, 2016, and a final Official Statement dated March 15, 2016 (the "Official Statement"), each in such form as may be approved by the Town Treasurer, be and hereby are ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

<u>Further Voted</u>: to authorize the execution and delivery of a Refunding Escrow Agreement to be dated March 30, 2016, between the Town and U.S. Bank National Association, as Refunding Escrow Agent.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that the Town Treasurer and the Board of Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized to execute and deliver a continuing disclosure undertaking in compliance with SEC Rule 15c2-12 in such form as may be approved by bond counsel to the Town, which undertaking shall be incorporated by reference in the Bonds, as applicable, for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds from time to time.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that we authorize and direct the Treasurer to establish post issuance federal tax compliance procedures in such form as the Treasurer and bond counsel deem sufficient, or if such procedures are currently in place, to review and update said procedures, in order to monitor and maintain the tax-exempt status of the Bonds.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that each member of the Board of Selectmen, the Town Clerk and the Town Treasurer be and hereby are, authorized to take any and all such actions, and execute and deliver such certificates, receipts or other documents as may be determined by them, or any of them, to be necessary or convenient to carry into effect the provisions of the foregoing votes.

I further certify that the agenda for the meeting, a copy of which is attached hereto, was posted on the bulletin board of the town at least 24 hours before the meeting in compliance with Section 7-11 of the Town Charter.

I further certify that the votes were taken at a meeting open to the public, that no vote was taken by secret ballot, that a notice stating the place, date, time and agenda for the meeting (which agenda included the adoption of the above votes) was filed with the Town Clerk and a
