Weekly Video Update, March 14, 2022

Mr. Boudreau noted that it's daylight savings and the Fire Department reminds everyone to change the batteries in their smoke detectors.

 The total number of Covid cases for this past week (not including yesterday) according to our MAVEN data was 8, down from 10 of last week. Numbers continue to drop from from week to week. The total number of cases reported to the BOH, including home tests over the last two weeks was 15, down from 24 reported last week. The total number reported by Scituate public schools was 6. We had a positivity rating over the last 14 days at 1.50%, down from 2.93% of last week. Plymouth County is at 2.2%, down from 3.1% of last week. State wide the positivity rate yesterday for the past 7 days was 1.67% down from the previous week of 1.82%. So, numbers are trending down across the board.

We continue to urge people to please get vaccinated and boostered to prevent from being seriously ill and hospitalized. Vaccinations and boosters are widely available. Go to mass.gov for details.

Test kits are now available for seniors at the COA. Limit 2.

- 2. Widow's Walk clubhouse renovation project is on punch list items. We had two responses to the RFP, both from two very well-respected local restaurants; Hibernian from Scituate and Mother Anna's from Pembroke. We will have a contract for the Board to execute tomorrow night. Course is closed to walkers starting yesterday as the grounds crew prepares the course for opening on April 1.
- 3. The Green sand filter installed on well 17A is complete and has been inspected and approved by the DEP for use. The water department has brought this well back on line. The additional water from 17A will be critical for us to maintain supply as we will be taking the plant off line 3/28-4/8 for a carbon re-activation project. Periodically, the carbon in the filter in the water treatment plant needs to be replaced or re-activated. Because of a lack of redundancy in the plant (we only have one carbon filter) the plant will be off line while the project is underway.
- 4. It is an earlier pot hole season this year with the large amount of snow followed by warm days and cold nights. That's perfect pot hole weather! Crews will be out all week filling potholes and making temporary repairs. Reports of potholes should go to either the highway department or DPW office.
- 5. Congratulations to the Scituate High Boys Basketball and Hockey teams as they move into the Final Four of the state championship tourney. Hockey will play Hanover Tuesday

night at 5:15 PM at the Gallo Arena in Bourne. Basketball will be facing Malden Catholic at 6:30 PM on Wednesday at Taunton High. I know hockey tickets must be purchased in advance of the game. A link is available on the SPS web page. If SHS hockey wins this game, the next game will be at the Boston Garden. Good Luck to all!
