INSTALLATION OF HARDSCAPE -TERACE AND SITTING WALL

Install Caledonia granite patio as shown on plan. The patio will be set on 6" of compacted $\frac{3}{4}$ " dense grade and 1" of bedding sand. The granite will be 1.5" thick ,6 "multiples or 2'x3' rectangles. Polymeric sand will be swept between the granite. 36'x25' cut in an oval.

Complete material, labor and tax.-----\$49,650

Install 45 linear feet of old jumbo cobblestones set in 3-4" of mortar, as shown on the plan. ------\$1,035

Install concrete footing 12" deep for the stone wall. The concrete will be set on 6" of crushed stone and
will have re-rod in it\$1,334

Construct 47 linear feet of round fieldstone single faced retaining wall as shown on the plan. The wall will be 18" high and will return on both sides 10 feet in towards the middle of the wall. Includes one wheelchair area.

Complete material, labor and tax\$9,085
Fabricate and install 2" thick rock faced Caledonia granite for the top of the entire wall. The granite will overhang the wall by 1.5" on both sides and ends\$11,200
Install stone water feature\$8,620
Install solar panel and receptacle, conduit and wiring for the stone feature water pump\$3,137
Install 305 gallon Norwesco plastic cistern to collect and hold rain water from the left rear of the library. Install 2" P.V.C. pipe down to the terrace area\$2,692
Install solar lights around terrace with a solar panel. Seven fixtures with conduit and wiring\$3,684
Educational signage. Supply and install four 18"x18" signs describing the benefits and attributes of certain plants and plant pollinators. The signs will be secured on 4"x4" fir posts\$920

POLLINATOR GARDEN/TREES TO BE DONATED BY THE GOULDING FAMILY:

Supply and install shade trees and plantings as shown on the plan. The plants will be purchased at wholesale prices and will be installed by Family and Friends. Northern Oak will maintain the plantings for 3 years at no charge. Total price of the plants and amendments and mulch will depend on the side of the plants but my estimate is between \$ 3,500.00 and \$4,000.00. Value if full price------\$6,800

MAINTENANCE FOR THREE YEARS DONATED BY NORTHERN OAK LANDSCAPE INC.

Include three years of maintenance for the hardscape and plantings. This will include spring clean up, fertilizing of the plant material re-edge and mulch the beds, prune all shrubs where needed and water the plants when needed.

Thoreau's Waye addendum/update:

Thank you for your questions and suggestions for this project at the November meeting. They were instrumental in helping us to nail down the details and be in a better position financially to complete the project. Attached is the revised budget and letters of support. Changes and additional information is as follows:

The project costs have increased approximately \$27,000 due to adding the prevailing wages, a 10% contingency as requested and additional materials for solar terrace lighting and water runoff retention for a central stone whale and irrigation. Outside funding has increased \$3,000 in the form of two 8' wooden benches added to the project to be donated by Daniel Goulding as well as additional maintenance funds for the future.


As previously mentioned, on-going maintenance will be provided for the first three years by Northern Oak Landscape, valued at \$2,400 per year, and beyond that by \$15,000 in funds held by the Scituate Library Foundation (SLF) that were memorial donations for Michael Goulding.

It is important to note that while shade trees and a pollinator garden are included in a description of this project because they are an integral part of the whole picture, they are NOT included in the requested CPC funding. CPC funding would cover hard costs of the granite and cobblestone terrace, seating wall with solar lighting and a central stone whale that will ideally spout runoff rain water. The trees and garden will be funded by the Goulding Family, as well as two 8' wooden benches to sit opposite the sitting wall and facing the Lawson Tower.


As far as use of this small park area is concerned, I have spoken at length with Maura Glancy at the Recreation Department. She feels this area could be a great spot for various recreation outings including story times. The Recreation Committee has not met since early November but this project will be presented at their January meeting on 1/20.

In addition, Jessi Finnie (Library Director) and Marla Minier (President of the Scituate Garden Club) are co-applicants on two grant requests revolving around pollinator gardens. One was approved for \$2,400 from Scituate Education Fun and another for \$10,000 is pending with the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. Both of these involve seminar components and which Jessi and Marla have both said would be held in this are if available.

Also attached are photos of similar such areas at libraries in Camden, ME and Weymouth, MA for visualization purposes. These outdoor spaces are increasingly popular in general and during this never-ending pandemic in particular!
