

Weekly Video update May 28, 2024

1. I want to thank everyone who participated and attended the Town's Memorial Day Parade and service on the Common yesterday. A great turn-out for the service on the Common. Thanks to all who participated and marched and special thanks to the Grounds Department for making the Common look so great, The Veterans Advisory Council, Legion and VFW for organizing and overseeing the event and to Sarah Inferrera, the Administrative Assistant in the Department of Veteran Services for organizing the event in the absence of a veterans agent
2. Water update for the week. Tack Factory Pond is at +4" down from +7" and the Reservoir is +5.5" down from +6". Rainfall over the past 7 days was 1.85" measured at the plant. Demand for the past week was 1.305 mgpd, up from last week at 1.274 mgpd.
3. A reminder that beach stickers are required from now through Labor Day. Stickers can be purchased on line under "Online Services" on the Town's web page, in person at the Treasurer's Office or by mail. Instructions are on the Treasurer's web page.

5. The Purple Dinosaur Playground renovation will start on **Tuesday, May 28, 2024**, and should take approximately 6 weeks, weather permitting. This Community Preservation Committee (CPC) project entails replacing the existing playground equipment with updated structures tailored for children aged 2 to 5. Throughout this time, the playground will not be accessible.
6. The Town of Scituate is gearing up for a water main line replacement initiative along Jericho Road, covering a distance of about 4,000 feet from Turner Road to Beaver Dam Road. Last week, pipe, materials, and equipment were delivered and stored at the parking lot situated at the intersection of Jericho Road and Turner Road and along the project route. The project starts on today, Tuesday, May 28, 2024, with the contractor mobilizing and construction starting tomorrow at the intersection of Jericho Road and Turner Road, with work hours scheduled from 7 AM to 4 PM. On **Wednesday, May 29, 2024**, residents residing on Turner Road between Scituate Avenue and the Turner/Jericho Road intersection can anticipate a temporary water outage during late morning or early afternoon hours. 7. In addition to the water work, a contractor will be repairing two areas of seawall that had been damaged in recent storms on Turner and Oceanside. Small sections at the top of the wall in those areas had broken off. The work will take about a week to complete.
8. Scituate Water Department wants to remind residents that annual water conservation measures are now in effect and run through September 30. All outdoor watering must occur before 9 AM and after 5 PM.
Between May 1 and September 30, automatic irrigation systems may be used one date per week, as designated by the Scituate Water Division according to precinct. See the Town web site for details.
 - a. Properties in Precinct 1 may irrigate lawns on Monday
 - b. Properties in Precinct 2 may irrigate lawns on Tuesday
 - c. Properties in Precinct 3 may irrigate lawns on Wednesday
 - d. Properties in Precinct 4 may irrigate lawns on Thursday
 - e. Properties in Precinct 5 may irrigate lawns on Friday

These restrictions are state restrictions and do not have anything to do with the amount of water in our reservoir or the amount of rainfall that we have experienced. It is imposed on the water basin that Scituate gets our water from.

When Scituate's Reservoir falls to a level of 36 feet (49% full), the Scituate Water Division has the standing authority to implement a total outdoor watering ban. As of May 26, 2015, no new in-ground systems may be connected to the town's drinking water supply. Fines for violating this rule may be levied on the homeowner as well as the system installer.

Violation of these conservation measures may result in fines of up to \$300.00 per day (Scituate Code of General Bylaws, Section 30660).

9. The grouting work on the Lighthouse was completed last week. The general contractor has removed the scaffolding and bracing. The painting is now scheduled to begin towards the end of this week, weather dependent. Window replacement and other interior work will be ongoing. The project should be completed by early in June. The Historic Society has tentatively set August 7, National Lighthouse Day, as the date to celebrate the renovation of Scituate Light. Details to follow.
10. Scituate Fire Department and Scituate CERT team, supported by the Scituate Rotary Club, are hosting monthly free Stop the Bleed Class and Hands-Only CPR sessions starting on Thursday, May 30, 2024 at the Public Safety Complex from 6 PM to 8 PM Limited seating: Only the first 20 people who reserve a seat will be accommodated. 11. Dana-Farber's Mammography Van

On Thursday, June 13, 2024, from 7 AM to 3:15 PM, the Mammography Van will be available. Women aged 40 and older interested in scheduling an appointment can call the Mammography Van office at 617-632-1974. Dana-Farber will seamlessly obtain prior mammography films/images with permission, ensuring a user-friendly process. The van will be stationed at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, 465 First Parish Road, Scituate, conveniently located across from Town Hall at the corner of Route 3A and First Parish Road. Special thanks to Reverend Natasha Stewart and St. Luke's Episcopal Church for graciously hosting the Mammography Van. The van is fully licensed and inspected by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. This annual contest, initiated in 2021, recognizes the vital role crossing guards play in ensuring the safety of students and families traveling to schools. With over 500 nominations received for crossing guards across 48 communities, the program underscores the importance of their commitment and service. Kim and additional winners will be formally recognized at the Annual Safe Routes to School Awards Ceremony on Thursday, June 6, 2024.
13. The Scituate Food Pantry continues to see an increase in clients seeking assistance. The Food Pantry is deeply indebted and extremely grateful for the generosity of its donors. The pantry has a new list of most needed items as they are unable to get these items from the Greater Boston Food Bank.
