1. The total number of Covid cases for this past week according to our MAVEN data was 46, much higher than last week's 17, but the data from the previous week was only through Wednesday due to a problem with state data bank. Total number of cases reported to the BOH was 104 up from 93 last week and a much smaller jump then we reported last week. We had a positivity rating over the last 14 days of 9.54% a jump up from 8.8% of last week. Plymouth County is at 8.7%, up from last week's 7.98%. State wide the positivity rate yesterday for the past 7 days was 8.34% down from the previous week of 9.59%. Statewide there are 79 individuals in ICU up from 75 of last week. 29 patients are intubated, up from 25 of last week. So, the rate of increase seems to have slowed this week, with the state percentage positive actually declining. In addition, the latest numbers from the MWRA show that the levels of Covid detected in wastewater is declining. What does this all mean? Hopefully an easing of the recent Covid spike. Stay tuned. There are no state-wide mask mandates in place currently, although some

communities are putting mask mandates in place for public buildings. We will continue to follow state guidelines for masking and any changes in requirements.

We are not done with COVID yet. Although it is only one week, the numbers are trending up. There is a new Omicron variant, BA-2 that is now the dominant strain in the US. At this point, being vaccinated is a much better defense then not being vaccinated, so please, if you have not yet gotten vaccinated and can receive the vaccine, we urge you to do so. Vaccinations and booster are widely available. Go to mass.gov for details.

2. Water update. The reservoir remained was even yesterday, down from +1.25". tack factory pond was at +1.00" down from +1.25" last week. Average daily demand was at 1.629 mgpd, up sharply from 1.204 mgpd of last week's usage. Summer usage numbers have begun! Please do your part to conserve water as we enter the heavy water use season. Manganese measured at the WTP is at .224 which is high enough to cause discolored water but should not be much of an issue as the plant is still not producing large volumes of water. As the temperatures rise, so will the Manganese levels in the water. Rainfall over the last 7 days was .2" measured at the Plant.

Celco, our water contractor, will be installing services on Sassamon Road and Lantern Lane this week.

The water department will be doing targeted flushing in several neighborhoods starting at 8:00 pm. Old Forge Road, First Parish between CJCH and Beaver Dam, Lawson Road, Lawson Terrance, Scituate high School, Aberdeen Drive, and Arbor Way. This is part of the ongoing maintenance of the water system. Flushing may cause brown water in areas around town. Please check your water when you get up tomorrow morning and flush if necessary.

- 3. With water updates and spring comes a proliferation of car wash fund raisers. Just a reminder to those planning a car wash, prior permission of the water department is required. Please contact the water department at 781-545-8735
- 4. The concession at the Widows Walk golf Course to opened this past Thursday. The "Drift In" restaurant is being run by the owners of the Hibernian Tavern in Scituate Harbor. I know everyone is excited for the restaurant to open and start serving food and drink. They will be serving lunch and dinner to start, expanding to breakfast on the weekends.
