# Weekly Covid Update, June 13, 2022

- The total number of Covid cases for this past week according to our MAVEN data was 25, down from last week's 36. Total number of cases reported to the BOH was 76 down from 91 last week. We had a positivity rating over the last 14 days of 8.97% up .10% from 8.87% of last week. Plymouth County is at 7.1%, down from last week's 8.36%. State wide the positivity rate yesterday for the past 7 days was 6.53% down from the previous week of 7.73%. Statewide there are 54 individuals in ICU down from 70 of last week. 18 patients are intubated, down from 19 of last week. So declining numbers across the board as the weather gets nicer.
- 2. Water update. The reservoir remained was at +1.75" yesterday, up from 1.00" last week. Tack Factory pond was at +1.75% up from last week's measurement +1.00" last week. Average daily demand was at 1.553 mgpd, down from 1.669 mgpd of last week's usage. Summer usage numbers have begun! Please do your part to conserve water as we enter the heavy water use season. Manganese measured at the WTP is high enough to cause discolored. As the temperatures rise, so will the Manganese levels in the water. Rainfall over the last 7 days was 2.02" measured at the Plant.

A reminder that as of 5/1 the state required water restrictions are in place. These restrictions are issued by the state. All outdoor watering must occur before 9:00 am and after 5:00 pm. Automatic irrigation systems can be used one day per week as designated by the Scituate Water Division according to precinct. Information is available at www.scituatema.gov/water-division

- 3. The water department will be holding an "Open House" at the water treatment plant tomorrow (June 14<sup>th</sup>) from 2:00 pm 6:00 pm. Residents can learn about the current water treatment process at the Old Oaken Bucket Treatment Plant and about the piloting process that has taken place to identify the proposed treatment process for the new water treatment facility.
- 4. In addition to the open house, residents can go to the town web site or go to <u>www.ScituateSurvey.com</u> to take a brief survey about the proposed new treatment plant. The survey will ask for your email address which we will use to send news and updates as we move forward in the process.
- 5. With water updates and spring comes a proliferation of car wash fund raisers. Just a reminder to those planning a car wash, prior permission of the water department is required. Please contact the water department at 781-545-8735
