1. Water update. Reservoir took a big jump last week. We are at +6", last week we were at -17.5". Tack Factory Pond is at +3", last week we were at +1.5". Average daily demand was at 1.067 MGD down from last week's 1.125 MGD. With the reservoir being full at this time, water restrictions are rescinded and we are returning to normal usage rules.

Rainfall over the last 7 days was 1.87" measured at the Plant.

Celco will be in town tomorrow to finish services on Foxwell Lane.

- 2. The Town Hall, Library and COA will be closed on Friday, December 16th from 8:30-11:45 am for training purposes. The library will re-open following the training. We have done this previously to ensure that all non-public safety employees are able to attend the training with as little disruption as possible. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience.
- 3. The Scituate Food Pantry is helping more residents than ever before. They need donations of food products that they cannot get from the Greater Boston Food Bank. New Hatherly School Building Project Update: Designer Selection Process

Dr. Robert Dutch (Director of Business and Finance), Kevin Kelly (Town Facility Director) and I joined the leadership from Vertex (Owners Project Manager) in attending the November 15, 2022 MSBA Designer Selection Meeting. I spoke on behalf of the district highlighting the qualities WE (the School Building Committee) agreed upon in representing the best firm and fit for Scituate Public Schools. The goal of the meeting was to "shortlist" Designers/Architects to the interview round being held on November 29th. The committee voted unanimously to move all 3 Designer/Architect firms forward to the interview round on November 29th.

On Tuesday, November 29, 2022, the Massachusetts School Building Authority Designer Selection Panel ("DSP") interviewed the finalists.

In accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 7C, Sections 44 through 58, and the MSBA Designer Selection Procedures, the Designer Selection Panel voted to rank the finalists, in order of qualifications, as follows for the subject project:

- 1. Dore + Whittier Architects, Inc.
- 2. Jonathan Levi Architects, Inc.
- 3. Studio G Architects, Inc.

The Designer Selection Panel determined that Dore + Whittier Architects, Inc. possesses the requisite skills and experience for this project, particularly in light of their extensive experience in the design and construction of schools in Massachusetts.

The Scituate School District will now take the appropriate local steps necessary to award the contract for designer services to the first-ranked firm and authorize fee and contract negotiations. Once the negotiations process is completed, an introductory meeting will be held with Dore & Whittier and the School Building Committee to discuss next steps in the process. We will communicate with our community the date/time/location of that meeting and our progress on the Hatherly School Project.
