Select Board Member, Maura Curran welcomed everyone and introduced Board of Health Director, Drew Scheele.

Drew Scheele, Board of Health Update

Mr. Scheele provided a Covid Update. The town had 25 cases this week, with several break through cases. The Delta variant is still out there and is highly contagious. Scituate has a highly vaccinated population of 75%. We are doing a great job but please get vaccinated if you haven't already. Children ages 5 - 11 are now able to get vaccinated. Residents can visit mass gov for information on boosters, or call 2-1-1, or your local pharmacy.

Kevin Cafferty, DPW Update

Mr. Cafferty noted we are paving around the common - Beaver Dam and First Parish. This work is expected to be completed today. Peggotty Beach Parking Lot will be top coated by the end of the season. Next year we plan to pave the following streets:

Old Oaken Bucket Rd, Brook St, 1100 feet on Tilden Rd., Utility Rd, Cedarwood Rd, Fairview Ave, Chittenden Rd, and Bailey's Causeway.

The DPW crews are still cleaning up from the storm and doing tree removal as well as preparing for Veteran's Day. We are also starting to put sanders on the trucks in anticipation of winter.

The reservoir was +2" yesterday and Tack Factory Pond was +5". The average daily demand for the last 7 days was 1.1 MGD with 80% of water provided by wells.

There are no new water mains being installed at this point, but some new services primarily on Brook and Bradford, possibly Tilden and Rainbow Court, and maybe Foam. We had a small 2" water main break on Jawl Ave. late on Friday and crew will be back out today to continue repairs.

Manganese levels are still dropping at Old Oaken Bucket but total organic carbon (TOC) remains high.

Crews are training on the new equipment at Well 17A and new Greensand Filter Plant. The Pilot study is ongoing at the water treatment plant with encouraging results.

Ms. Curran thanked the entire DPW crew for their clean up efforts over the past week. She encourages anyone to notify DPW if they need assistance. To enter Senior Center today, please use Cudworth entrance.
